Film & Television Work – Trick Dog Training

Course No. 26535
Qualification: TAFE PLUS Statement

Pre-Requisites: Applicants are reminded that the welfare and ethical treatment of all animals is a priority in this course. Dogs need to be receptive to in-class training, as follows:

- Dogs must not be aggressive towards other dogs.
- Dogs must be 6 months of age or older.
- Dogs must be able to sit stay for 5 seconds, 1 ½ metres from their owner, on a loose lead, in a low level distraction situation.
- Dogs need to be accustomed to being tied and left for short periods of time (max 1hr).

This course introduces dog owners to what they need to know to get their dog to behave for film and television work. Owners are introduced to the methods of training used by animal trainers in the industry, guided through the steps to train their dog for all the commonly used behaviours used in working dogs in film and television, and will gain skills that they can use to train their dog to perform the variety of behaviours that may be requested of it. In addition many tricks are introduced and practiced to give the dog a solid repertoire of different behaviours. Dogs will have a photo shoot and photos will be submitted to an animal talent agency.

- Positive reinforcement methodology and why film trainers use it
- Using a bridge in training
- Practical dog training using positive reinforcement
- Dog agility
- Introduction to a film set
- Preparing your dog for working on a film set
- Dog body language
